Course Profile: Description and Access for Archives

Course Number: LIS 7780 and HIS 7820

Credits: 3 Credits

Prerequisite or corequisite: LIS 7710 (or HIS 7840)

Rationale for Inclusion in Curriculum:

The description of and systems used for accessing archival materials are unique and separate from traditional library description. This course investigates the description of archival materials with particular emphasis on the application of electronic technologies and standard practices developed in the archival profession.

Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the course students will be able to:

1. Compare various types of descriptive archival records for access.
2. Create an Encoded Archival Description (EAD) finding aid.
3. Use mark-up languages and apply suitable stylesheets for metadata.
4. Interpret standards of description for use in the archival profession.
5. Critique content management systems available to archival professionals.

Content:

1. Comparisons of various cataloging standards used in archives
2. Assessment of finding aid standards for improved access
3. Application of Describing Archives: A Content Standard (DACCS) to archival materials
4. Mark-up languages based in XML and XML editors
5. Mark-up of finding aids in EAD
6. Assessment of Content Management Systems
7. Research of new trends in archival description

Course Methodology:

Lectures, discussions, hands-on projects, exams, research papers, presentations, and other assignments
