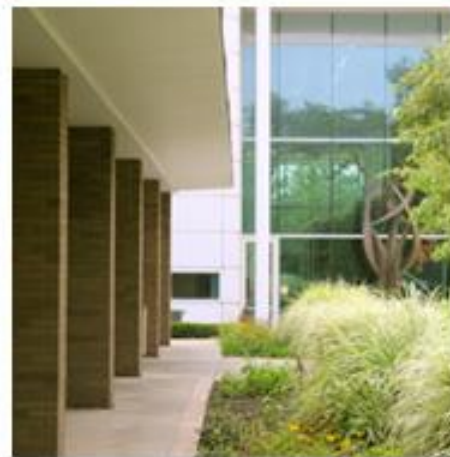


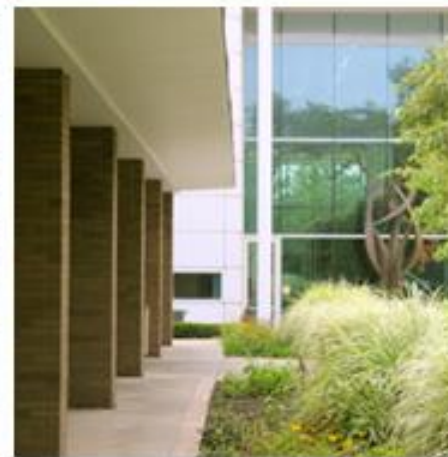

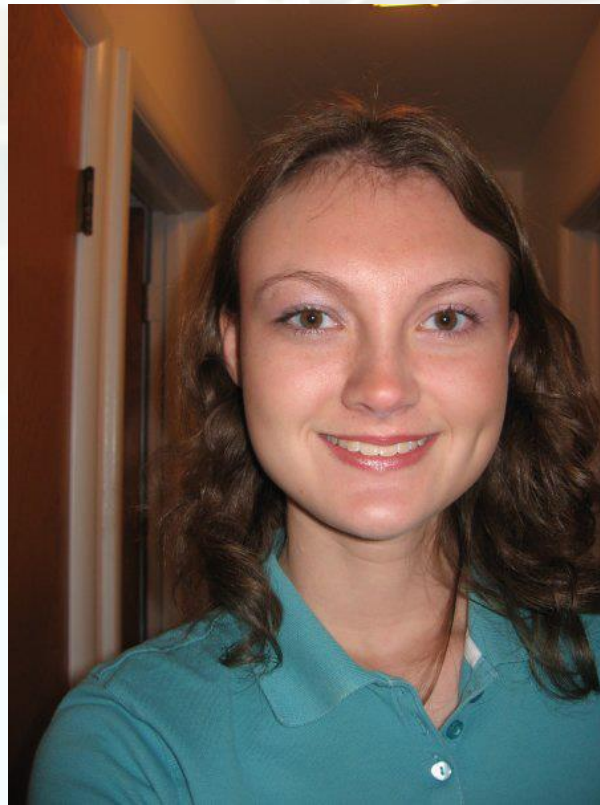
Paulette E. Groen Endowed Scholarship

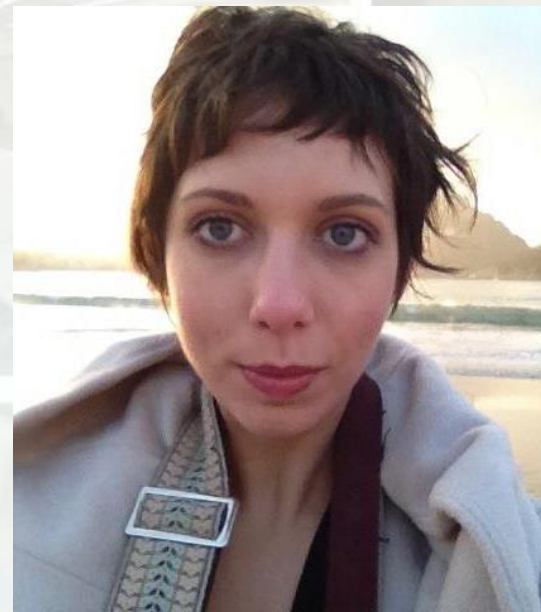
Margery A. Long Scholarship for Archival Administration

Mrs. Rockall recognized the difficulty of putting oneself through school. Through her scholarship, she assists those who wish to improve and advance themselves.

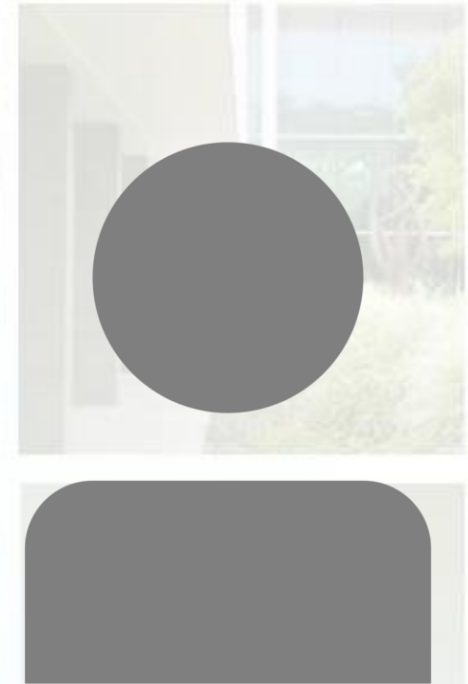

Nancy Robertson has served as the state librarian of Michigan since she was appointed by Governor Jennifer Granholm in November 2005. Some of her accomplishments at the Library of Michigan include involvement in the design and construction of the Martha W. Griffiths Rare Book Room, overseeing the redesign of the Michigan eLibrary (MeL) and securing additional funding for MeL in 2013
