In addition to developing skills through internship projects within museum departments, interns participate in a weekly seminar series and interact directly with the Museum's visitors by leading public tours in the galleries.

The Thomas J. Watson Library is the primary research library of The Metropolitan Museum of Art. The intern will work with professional librarians and archivists on a joint project with Museum Archives to preserve digital and analog records of 21st century Met special exhibitions. Specific daily tasks will include transferring digital press kit components from physical media into a digital asset management system, scanning of analog materials, creation of descriptive metadata, and MARC cataloging. Additional responsibilities undertaken as opportunities arise may include processing of other Museum records, reference assistance to Museum staff and non-staff scholars, and historical research. The ideal candidate will be enrolled in a graduate program in library/information science or archives management. Through the primary project the intern will develop skills in archival/library cataloging and metadata creation, and will gain detailed knowledge of the Museum's recent (21st century) exhibition program. Additionally, other projects in Watson Library will help provide experience across a broad area of librarianship.
