

What is available for Financial Aid, Scholarships and Assistantships?

#### **School of Information Sciences (SIS) Scholarships**

#### <u>SIS Scholarships</u>

- More than 20 available—may be based on academic merit, students pursuing certain specializations (E.g. SLM or Archives) or Students from underrepresented backgrounds
- Award \$500-1500; students may apply for two; must be admitted student to apply
- March 1 Deadline







School of Information Sciences Scholarships

#### Wayne State Private Scholarships

- WSU Private Scholarships
  - Hundreds of scholarships available, it 'automatically' matches students with possible scholarships
  - Must complete FAFSA to be eligible for need-based scholarships

#### Graduate Professional Scholarship

- Pays full time tuition for Fall and Winter semesters
- 30% of applicants win
- Approximately 15 SIS recipients each year
- March 1 deadline

#### **ALA Spectrum Scholarship**

- Annually provides up to 60 students from racial and ethnic underrepresented groups with a \$5,000 tuition scholarship and \$1,500 in professional development funds as they pursue a master's degree in library and information science.
- The Spectrum Scholarship Program actively recruits and provides scholarships to American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, Middle Eastern and North African, and/or Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander students to assist them with obtaining a graduate degree and leadership positions within the profession and ALAScholarshi

ALA Spectrum Scholarship

#### Scholarships for Students from Diverse Backgrounds

- American Association of Law Libraries & Thomson West George A. Strait Minority Scholarship • MLIS candidates from historically underrepresented backgrounds who have experience and an interest to work in law libraries are encouraged to apply. Award amount varies.
- American Indian Library Association Virginia Mathews Memorial Scholarship • Qualified American Indian applicants who have been accepted in to an ALA accredited program are eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- American Library Association Spectrum Scholarship • Students from historically underrepresented populations who have completed no less that 1/3 of their MLIS degree from an ALA-accredited program are encouraged to apply. Recipients receive \$5,000 scholarship in addition to professional development support.
- Asian Pacific American Librarians Association Scholarship •

Financial assistance is provided to a student of Asian or Pacific background who is enrolled, or Lateesa James (MLIS '17) has been accepted into, a master's or doctoral degree program in library and/or information Initiative to Recruit a Diverse Workforce science at an ALA-accredited school. Award amount is not specified.

Association of Research Libraries Kaleidoscope Program •

The goal of the ARL Kaleidoscope Program (formerly the Initiative to Recruit a Diverse Workforce Initiative) is to attract master of library and information science (MLIS) students from historically underrepresented racial and ethnic groups to careers in research libraries and archives.

**Diversity Scholarships** 

#### **Scholarships for Students from Diverse Backgrounds**

- <u>Association of Specialized and Cooperative Library Agencies Century Scholarship</u> A scholarship of up to \$2,500 that funds services or accommodation for a library school student(s) with disabilities admitted to an ALA-accredited library school.
- <u>Chinese American Librarians Association Scholarships</u> Students of Chinese descent or nationality and who are enrolled as full-time students in an ALAaccredited program are encouraged to apply. Students can apply for any of the four scholarships CALA offers (totaling \$2200) through a single application.
- HistoryMakers Fellowship, Mentoring, Training and Placement Institute

Seeks African-American archivists who recently graduated with a MLIS degree. Applicants must have an interest in working with African-American archival collections. Fellows will receive a \$37,000 stipend.

Medical Library Association Scholarship for Minority Students

African American, Hispanic, Asian, Native American, or Pacific Islander American individuals entering into an ALA-accredited program, who wish to study health sciences librarianship are encouraged to apply. Recipients are awarded up to \$5,000.

#### <u>REFORMA Scholarship</u>

The REFORMA Scholarship provides up to \$1500 of financial assistance to encourage and enable Spanish speakers to pursue or advance a career in Library and Information Science at MLIS or PhD level

**Diversity Scholarships** 

- Ten (10) Graduate Student Assistantships in the University Library System
  - Eight in WSU Libraries.
  - Two (2) in the School of Information Sciences (SIS) Diversity Outreach GSA & Technology GSA
- The tuition scholarship pays for up to 10 graduate credits for each of the fall and winter semesters and up to 2 graduate credits for the spring/summer semester for up to 22 credits/year NOTE: only graduate credits listed on a student's Plan of Work
- GSAs work 20 hours per week rotating around a variety of roles in WSU libraries to provide a holistic perspective of academic librarianship, culminating in a special project their final semester
- Assistantship positions provide a salary (approximately \$20,686/year), tuition scholarship, and subsidized medical and dental insurance
  - Nine month contract mid-August to mid-May (summer employment may be available)

# Wayne State offers tuition assistance to full-time employees

- <u>Check out available jobs at at jobs.wayne.edu</u>
  - Tuition benefit pays for two courses a semester
- <u>Employee Tuition Assistance</u> Benefit pays 100% of the cost of tuition, regular registration fee, omnibus fee, and fitness center fee for eligible employees.
- <u>Reduced Tuition for Spouse/Child of Employee</u> Benefit pays 50% of the cost of tuition only for an eligible spouse/child of an eligible employee.
- <u>Reduced Tuition for Spouse/Child of Union of Part-Time</u> <u>Faculty (UPTF) Member</u> Benefit pays 50% of the cost of tuition only for an eligible spouse/child of an eligible UPTF member.

# How Do I Apply for Admission?



- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with GPA of 3.0 or better (or another degree beyond the BS)
- Meet the <u>Technology Requirements</u> of the degree or certificate program applying for:
  - MLIS and Certificate: <u>MLIS Technology Requirements</u>
  - MSIM: <u>MSIM Technology Requirements</u> and <u>MSIM Technical</u> <u>Competencies</u>
- Personal Statement (250-500 words/1-2 pages)
  - MLIS and certificate students: Statement should reflect relevant personal and academic background/experience
  - MSIM students: Address your experience/familiarity with required technical competencies needed for MSIM degree
- Resume or Curriculum Vitae
- Complete online <u>New Student Orientation</u> Not applicable for certificate-only students



## Admissions Requirements



#### **Alternative Admission Methods**

Applicants with an undergrad grade point average between 2.50 and 2.99 can satisfy this requirement by one of the alternative methods:

- Evidence of post-baccalaureate graduate course work completed with a grade point average of 3.0 or better in a minimum of 9 graduate credits OR
- 6 SIS credits as a non-degree student with a grade point average of 3.0 or better in each course Note: non-degree students are not eligible for financial aid OR
- Official score report for either of the following standardized tests taken within the last five years
  - Graduate Record Examination (GRE): A total score of 294 on the combined verbal and quantitative portions. The verbal portion must have a score of at least 153
  - Miller Analogies Test (MAT): official score report must indicate a score of at least 410

#### Alternative Admission Methods



#### How Do I Apply?

- 1. Apply online at <u>www.gradapply.wayne.edu</u>.
- 2. Compose and upload a <u>personal statement</u> reflecting relevant personal and academic background and experience. The statement should be a minimum of 250 words and a maximum of 500 words (1-2 pages).
- 3. Upload a current resume or curriculum vitae with your application.
- 4. Request official transcripts from each university you attended and have them sent directly to the WSU Office of Graduate Admissions, Wayne State University, Detroit, MI, 48202.
- 5. Pay \$50 Application fee.

#### **Application Dates for Admission** --- Recommended

- Fall classes beginning early September by July 1
- Winter classes beginning early January by November 1
- Spring classes beginning early May by April 1

# **Application Process**



- Admission process: Typically takes 2-4 weeks
- Your WSU Access ID will be emailed to you after submitting your application, allowing you to check the status of your application
- You will receive an e-mail from Graduate Admissions when a decision has been made on your application
- A letter from the School of Information Sciences will follow with information regarding your admission decision
  - If you are accepted to the program, this letter will contain information on orientation and your faculty advisor <u>Faculty contact information and areas of interest</u>
- All students are subscribed to the SIS discussion list, <u>SISINF</u>, prior to their first semester.
  - Important announcements such as registration dates, practicum application periods, scholarship deadlines and job openings are posted to SISINF
  - Students must login to Academica and activate their WSU email
- You have one year <u>(four semesters)</u> to begin at WSU, however need to reapply if you do not register your first semester
